

BONUS FOR LOVE ROAD LACKS \$1395

Sum of \$1060 Received Saturday Not Enough to Complete Fund Asked.

RESUME WORK MONDAY

Committees Take Up Campaign With Hope That One Day Will Suffice.

When the Chamber of Commerce ceased activities Saturday night the Fredericksburg railroad bonus was within \$1395 of completion, according to an announcement made by Secretary J. F. Carter. It was hoped the last of the \$50,000 would be secured yesterday, but although \$1060 was received in the course of the day the subscriptions were not sufficient to bring the bonus campaign to a conclusion.

To Complete Fund Monday.
"A strenuous effort will be made to get the balance on Monday," said Mr. Carter. "It is imperative that San Antonio completes its bonus at once; the date on which it should have been ready was passed several days ago. Business interests that have not yet given to the project must realize that the city is facing a critical situation and that their assistance is necessary."

"Notification has only to be given that the amount is in readiness and construction of the line will be commenced. R. A. Love, promoter of the road, has stated affairs are in such condition that construction can be inaugurated forty-eight hours after San Antonio has fulfilled its pledge. Fredericksburg has raised more than \$150,000 for the road and is anxiously awaiting news that this city has done its part."

Some Committees Quit Work.
Up to the present time, 366 firms and individuals have subscribed to the bonus. Some subscriptions have come in by mail and the rest have been obtained through the efforts of committees. While some committees have canvassed in the last two or three days, others have dropped out. Those directing the canvass believe co-operation of all committees on Monday will result in completion of the bonus by noon. Among the committees at work on Saturday were Ray M. Mackey, C. O. Austin, Charles Graebner, Fred W. Cook and R. H. Halff.
