

## NEW COMPANY ELECTS

### Three Rivers Glass Concern to Be Operating in 60 Days.

Officers of the Three Rivers Glass Company were elected Friday at a meeting of the directors. Construction of the factory at Three Rivers was ordered started at once and is expected to be in operation within 60 days.

Officers for the first year are: James Kapp, president; A. H. Morton, vice president; Charles R. Tips, secretary and treasurer, and H. S. Warrick, manager. All officers except Mr. Warrick are also directors. Other directors are: Adolph Wagner, William L. Stiles, D. J. Woodward, all of San Antonio, and H. T. Harber of Three Rivers.

Mr. Warrick is now in St. Louis, Mr. Tips said, arranging for purchase of machinery and other equipment, and has been called back to San Antonio to take charge of construction which will begin immediately. The plant, when in operation, will use Three Rivers gas for fuel and secure glass sand from pits near there. It will have a capacity of 150 gross of bottles daily, Mr. Tips said, soda water bottles and milk bottles to be the first class to be made. The factory will cater exclusively to Texas and Mexican trade.

The Three Rivers Glass Factory was chartered early in March and is capitalized for \$50,000.
