## Albert Menger Elected Coffee Firm President

"I am indeed proud that our directors have given the responsibility for leadership as president of this long-established San Antonio industry to my son, Albert," the new board chairman said.

The local coffee roasting firm's new president is a graduate of St. Mary's University. After graduation, he served five years with the U.S. Air Force, returning in 1945 to join the firm.
